Statement of Jeremiah A. O'Leary Jr., 405 Prince street, Alexandria, Va.

(Temple #7001) correspondent for The Washington D.C. Evening Star.

November 30, 1963.

I was present in the garage at Dallas Police Headquarters on Sunday morning November 24, 1963 and was an eye witness to the shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Most of the press there was unknown to me, however, I can say that Seth Kantor of the FBI Washington Bureau and Tony Ripley of the Detroit News were present.

By pictures which appeared in the Dallas News and Dallas Times Herald, it is certain that photographers Bob Jackson and Joe Heera were in the garage for they took still photos of the actual shooting from different angles. These pictures can be obtained for evidence.

Also, television cameramen for NBC and CBS but not ABC filmed the murder live and ~~the~~ NBC used it simultaneously. I believe CBS had it on tape and broadcast it later. These networks can furnish the films, including audio portion.

Most of the press corps is still here and can be found at the Statler or the Adelphi today by checking the register.

The names of most of the eye-witness press can be found by checking copies of their Monday newspapers (Nov. 25) at the Library of Congress where all printed matter in the United States is collected. Those who saw it wrote eye-witness stories.

There also were some foreign press representatives whose names I do not know but I heard them talking about it later.
