Upo arriving at Katzenbarh's office, he showed me a revised press release (attached) to be assued by the White House concerning captioned case. It proved to be principally the same as the one shown to Mr. Belmont and me last night, with the possible slight difference that last night's first paragraph had been stretched over three paragraphs. Katzenbach asked my opinion. I told him it was unchanged from last night, that it was our view that only the first paragraph of last night's draft be used, or the first three paragraphs of the current draft. Katzenbach agreed, but stated that we would probably be overruled by the White House. Ka ze ash made two additional points. He advised that he believed that Warren Olney had de intely been "dumped." He stated that he gave the "go ahead" on Lee Rankin late las: 135. He added that an approach would be made to Rankin immediately. K. . . . also told me that our report on captioned matter wo delivered to Chief Justice warren Monday morning. The Chief Justice apparently does z not want it delivered to his home over the week end inasmuch as he does not have a place to safely keep it. Mr. B injort telephonically advised the Director of the above matter following my return from Katzenbach's office. We called Katzenbach and advised him of the Director's strong leepings regarding the press release. Katzenbach stated that Sorenson of the Vitte House agreed with us, however Abel Fortas disagreed.
