You state in your letter that you were not certain which request of yours our 30 August 1977 letter was in response to. Our letter was responding to paragraph 9 of your 7 December 1976 letter to GSA requesting "transcripts of all intercepted telephone conversations at the Cuban and Russian Embassies in Mexico City, including those in which Oswald was overheard. Such transcripts were furnished to the Commission by the CIA."

You mention that you subsequently asked the Archives to send only the request over to us as to "whether the transcripts were ever sent to the Warren Commission, whether they are in any Commission files and if so, which, and any records relating to the Commission's knowledge of the intercepts." All portions of your request will be considered in the Information Review Committee's deliberations.
