

Paul and Gary Oswald's Notebook 10/27/69

One of the forgotten items I found today is a 3x5 card file of each separate items in Oswald's addressbook. Russian is among the things indicated (in different ink). I now recall this quite clearly. At the time I arranged for it to be made, I had turned on a rather nice woman who'd heard me on a Washington radio station. She was then not working, being a mother and a housewife. She phoned to ask if I had some work she could do in her spare time. I suggested this. There was a special reason. I believe this was in May 1967 Garrison was then much interested in this evidence, and I had discovered that some of the entries were for nonexistent addresses. In New Orleans I had just confirmed this, on my first trip there. I believed he might come up with something if he had these to shuffle around. He didn't.

It may still be possible. Some of the cards are separated out, into two smaller groups, I presume by Jim, separated with rubber bands.

This is one of the few items I have been able to retrieve. I got it a long time ago. If either of you visualizes and possible use, you are welcome to borrow it. Perhaps someone might want to examine it in this form and rearrange it, on the chance that might reveal something.

Paul might ask Jim if he thinks it worth the time at this juncture.
