At 3:05 a.m. 11-27-63 Inspector James R. Malley at Dallas; Texas, telephonically advised SA W. Marvin Gheesling that about one hour previously the Dallas Police Department had turned over to the Dallas office Lee Harvey Oswald's address book. Malley stated that a quick examination of this address book revealed it contained numerous names and addresses, including writing which appeared to be Russian. It also contained a listing of Juggers Chiles Stoval, Topography Company, and underneath that listing the word "microdots." A card in Oswald's wallet showed he was previously employed by that firm.

Malley advised that this address book together with Oswald's billfold is being transmitted to the Bureau by the most expeditious means available with request that the foreign language contained therein be translated and that Bureau review contents of these two items and set out appropriate leads.

Malley requested that Mr. Don Moore be alerted to this information.
