In accordance with U.S. Post Office regulations, the portion of the application listing the names of persons other than the applicant entitled to receive mail was discarded after the box was closed on May 14, 1963. During the summer of 1963, Oswald rented a post office box in New Orleans, listing the name "Hidell" in addition to his own name and that of his wife. Hidell was a favorite alias used by Oswald on a number of occasions. Diligent search has failed to reveal any person in Dallas or New Orieans by that name. It was merely a creation for his own purposes.

Your letter of December 10 has been received.
With regard to your first inquiry, we have no information about the discrepancy which appeared on page 529 of the FBI's Dallas report on the assassination of President Kennedy in addition to that set forth in my letter of November 27.

In response to your question about Lee Harvey Oswald's application for Post Office Box 2915 in Dallas, we have conducted a search of our records and have been unable to locate information establishing that the FBI had access to data on Oswald's application, other than that on the portion of the form listing his name as the applicant. At this time, we can locate no documentation for the FBI statement, included in Warren Commission Exhibit Number 2585, that our investgation revealed that Oswald had not indicated on his postal application that others would receive mail at that box. We concur with the Commission's finding that it is not known whether Oswald's application listed an "A. Hidell" as also entitled to receive mail at the box, inasmuch as a pertinent portion of the application had since been discarded.

I hope the above explanation resolves your questions.

We have previously identified the order for the murder weapon submitted to Klein's Sporting Goods Company in Chicago as having been written by Oswald. The gun was shipped to "A. Hidell, P. O. Box 2915, Dallas, Texas." -We have now identified the application for this P. O. Box as having been prepared by Oswald.

Dallas, by their letter 11/23/63, submitted application for P. O. Box 2915 , dated 10/9/62. This card bears the printed name "Lee Hoswald", home address "3519 Fairmore Avenue, Dallas, Texas. " and bears the handwritten signature "Lee H. Oswald." We have compared the pertinent printing and writing on this card and definitely identified it with known writing of suspect Lee H. Oswald, previously furnished to us. It should be noted that although Oswald used the name "A: Hidell" in placing the order for the murder weapon, this name does not appear on his application for the P. O. Box to which the gun was shipped.

A teletype is being dispatched to Dallas advising of this identification. This eridence is being retained in the Lahoratory.

As Jou will see from the enclosed documents，tie FiI indicated that no one other than Cswald could receive mail from Fust office 3ox 2915 （Commission Exhibit No．2585）．Yet the Commission concluded that it was not known who could receive ruail from Box 2915 because a document has been discarded（see enclused ivport，page 575）．

When a friend，Faul Cassidy，wrote to clarify this discrepency， he received on FBI docenent from Mr．James K．Hall indicating that the FBI was accurate：no ore other than Jswald was authorized to receize mail from Box 2915.

So I am interested in knowing whether this FBI memo（seき enciosure） is the FBI＇s official answer to the contraciction．I amaware that the Freedom Of Information ict does not require you to ansuer this siestion，but I am hoping that you can clarify this discrepancy for my own peace of mind．

Your letter of July 3 to the FBI's Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) Section, Records Management Division, has been referred to my office. Although our FOIPA personnel cannot answer specific questions about the information they process, my office can respond to some inquiries about our work in more detail.

The FBI report dated November 25, 1963, describes an examination of an application for Post office Box 2915 by Lee Harvey Oswald. The report also states that the name "A. Hidell" does not appear on the application. The application the FBI examined was a card. It is unclear whether our laboratory personnel knew that a portion of the application, which would have contained the names of persons other than Oswald entitled to receive mail, was missing or that it had been routinely detached and destroyed. Accordingly, any interpretation of our report should be limited to our work regarding the application card. As you are aware, the other portion of the application was destroyed after the box was closed in May, 1963; our report is not referring to that portion.

I hope that I have been of assistance.
