
Entertainer Says Oswald Knew Ruby

NEW YORK (AP) — An entertainer who worked for Jack Ruby says Lee Harvey Oswald knew Ruby before President John F. Kennedy was assassinated in 1963, according to the New York Sunday News.

In a copyright story, the newspaper said it interviewed Walter "Wally" Weston, who it described as a master of ceremonies at Ruby's Carousel night club in Dallas and a personal friend of Ruby's before the assassination.

Weston, according to the News, explained he didn't tell a Dallas detective and an FBI agent the story when they questioned him a day or two after the assassination "because he was not positive the man was Oswald and he wanted to discuss the incident with other Carousel employees."

The newspaper said Weston came forward to the News after hearing of a story it published in which a former CIA agent was said to have told the Senate Intelligence committee that Ruby made a secret trip to Havana in 1963 and conferred with Fidel Castro about the possibility of killing Kennedy.
