Reference is made to Foreign Service Despited Humber 234 dated November 2, 1959, concerning subject's remunciation of his American citizenship at the United States Embassy, Loscow, Russia, on October 31, 1959.

It is noted that among other items, subject surrendered his United States Presport Number 1733242 to an American Imbassy official. His last known residence as indicated in your despatch was The Letropole Hotel, Lioscow, where he was residing in a nontourist status.

Your attention is directed to the report of Special Agent John W. Fain, Dallas, Texas, dated Lay 12, 1960; entitled "Funds Transmitted to Residents of Russia; Internal Security -E," a copy of which was furnished to the Department of State on lay 24, 1,50.

In that report you will note that subject's mother, irs. larguerite C. Oswald, Fort Worth, Texas, adviced that she recently received a letter addressed to her son from the albert Schweitzer College in Switzerland indicating that lee Oswald was expected at the college on April 20, 1950. She stated subject had taken his birth certificate with him when he left home. She was apprehensive about his safety because three letters she had written him since January 22, 1960, have been returned to her undelivered.

Since there is a possibility that an imposter is using Oswald's birth certificate, any current information the Department of State may have concerning subject will be appreciated. 39-61911
