JOSEPH ALLEN SKILES, TWO FIVE THREE ZERO BRIAR RIDGE,
HOUSTON, TEXAS, ADVISED SA TERENCE D. DINAN ON DEC. FOUR,
INSTANT, THAT HE WAS IN THE THIRD, FOURTH, FIFTH, AND SIXTH
GRADES WITH LEE HARVEY OSWALD AT ARLINGTON HEIGHTS ELEMENTARY
SCHOOL, FORT WORTH, TEXAS. HE DESCRIBED OSWALD AS A RATHER
WELL LIKED BOY WHO SEEMED TO GET ALONG WELL WITH HIS FELLOW
STUDENTS. HE STATED THAT EVEN AT THIS EARLY AGE OSWALD
FREQUENTLY QUESTIONED THE THEORY OF DEMOCRACY WHENEVER IT
WAS MENTIONED AND SEEMED TO BE IN THE PRINCIPAL-S OFFICE
QUITE FREQUENTLY BECAUSE OF ARGUMENTS WITH HIS TEACHERS.
STILES LAST SAW OSWALD WHEN THEY WERE IN THE TENTH GRADE AND
BOTH WERE PRACTICING WITH THE FOOTBALL TEAM. ON THAT DAY,

OSWALD ARGUED WITH THE COACH, STATING THAT HIS PRACTICE RULES VIOLATED CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS. OSWALD WAS KICKED OFF THE TEAM AND STILES SAW NO MORE OF HIM.

STILES STATED THAT HE LEARNED THROUGH HIS MOTHER, ALLENE STILES, FOUR ONE ZERO FIVE SOUTHWEST BOULEVARD, FORT WORTH, TEXAS, THAT HIS UNCLE, HOWARD RAY PARKER, WHO IS A SOCIAL WORKER IN DALLAS, TEXAS, WAS IN A BUILDING ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE TEXAS BOOK DEPOSITORY WHEN PRESIDENT KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED AND HEARD THE SHOTS.
