She said she had not called the information to the FBI Office with reference to MURPHY's "blow up" when he left until after LAURA LAYFIELD called BARBARA LANATELLA because she felt MURPHY was "upset" over the death of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. FISCHER said LAYFIELD is presently employed as a hostess at the Court Club in the hotel and normally reports for work at 5:00 P.M., remaining until closing time.

She said she had no personal knowledge of LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY, also known as JACK RUBENSTEIN, and that she had never been in any of RUBY's clubs and did not believe she had ever personally seen him. She knew nothing of any relationship between RUBY and OSWALD.

Mrs. JO FISCHER advised that persons in her office have made a very thorough and complete check of all applications for the period October 29 to November 3, 1963 and had not discovered any application that would indicate that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had appeared at the Personnel Office to seek work as a bell man during that period.
