MARINE CORPS DENTAL X-RAYS ID WRONG OSWALD Exhumation Doctors Given Planted X-rays

The Norton Report on the 1981 Exhumation and Identification of Lee Harvey Oswald, published in the January 1984 Journal of Forensic Sciences, incorrectly identifies the exhumed and re-interred remains as "the real Lee Harvey Oswald".

This erroneous identification was made by matching Marine Corps dental X-rays furnished by the Military Personnel Records Center, St Louis, MO, with dental X-rays made at the exhumation autopsy. The match was excellent because the Marine Corps dental X-rays are X-rays planted in OswaldsMarine Corps file.

The planted Marine Corps dental X-rays, noted as made in Santa Ana CA, 27 March 1958, are not X-rays of the real Lee Harvey Oswald's teeth. On that day he was 4,600 miles west of Santa Ana, CA, serving with his radar unit in Atsugi, Japan. The Marine Corps pay records confirm his overseas duty at this time.

The planted Marine Corps dental X-rays of Santa Ana, CA, 27 March 1958, are those of a man who seven months later was substituted for the real Lee Harvey Oswald and given his name and ID papers preparatory to being sent on a CIA spy mission to Moscow.

With no reason to suspect the Marine Corps dental X-rays and therefore not bothering to check the location of the real Lee Harvey Oswald's teeth 27 March 1958, the Norton Exhumation team stumbled into a 4,600-mile error set up by the planted X-rays.

This mis-identification of the remains in the Tarrant County, TX, grave confirms the substitution story in alias Oswald by R B Cutler and W R Morris, currently under the publisher's scalpel at Ramparts Press. Your guess as to the Pub-date is as good as the Pub's. W R is holding on with both hands.

Lest any reader become complacent about this research, there are two leads that need your help in running down:

- 1) the Report indicates dental X-rays were taken 25 October 1956 in San Diego, CA. These were not used in identifying the remains. If MPRC has them, they should be available.
- 2) hopefully someone can locate a dentist who might have made X-rays of the real Oswald's teeth between mid-July and mid-October 1956 in Ft Worth, TX. They would be more than helpful in confirming the substitution story.
