He advised that in July 1963 he was released from a Federal Prison at Seagoville, Fexas, and following his release lived in Dallas, Texas, at 4440 Travis Street. Sometime in July 1963, he was at the Ramous Bar, Wellinney and Lemon Streets in Dallas, Texas. 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JOHN ELWAED RULLINGERSI, 909 tlinton Street, Fhiladelphia, Pa., stated he was aware of the identity of Interviewing Agent and was told that he did not have to make any statement, that any statement he made to Interviewing Agent which was in anyway false he could be prosecuted in Federal court. He was advised that he night consult an attorney prior to making a statement, and that any statement made by him could be used against him in a court of law.

RODDENSEERY stated he was released from a Federal prison in Seagoville, fex., on July 19, 1953, and shortly thereafter obtained an apartment at 4040 fravis Street, Dallas, fex.

On the Wednesday evening following his release from prison, July 24, 1963, he was at the Fanous Ear, Mc Kirney and Lemon Streets, Pallas, Fex. He observed a young man come into the bar and gained a first impression that this individual might be a college student who had come into the bar from a coffee house across the street.

RODDENSERIC recalls that he was introduced to this individual by a Mexican maitress, "EAR-FAR," and that she said this man's name was LEE, ROLLENSELAN recalls that several times during the evening, the man known as LEE, spoke in a Spanish or Mexican dialect to the waitress and was corrected several times by her concerning his use of a proper phrase or idiom.

RODDEMERKE' states that the waitress asked LEE "how he was doing," and LEE replied be thought be "would go into the construction work." RODDERGERRY states that LEE was a young white male, probably in his middle or late 20s, 5'10" or 5'11" in height, dark hair, wearing khaki pants, and that his skin was peeling as though sunburned.
