On December 21, 1963 interview was conducted at Miami, Florida in connection with information that had been received from SYLVIA OSWALD, a Cuban refugee at Dallas, Texas, who advised that in September or October, 1963, she had been contacted by two members of the anti-FIDEL CUBANO organization Junta Revolucionaria (JURE), in connection with a family drive they were conducting. OSWALD stated they were accompanied by an individual whom they introduced as LEON OSWALD, whom Miss OSWALD stated to be identical with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Miss OSWALD said that one of the two members of the JURE contacting her was named LEOPOLDO.

On December 21, 1963, Mrs. ROBERTO GIBNEROS, 347 N.E. 16th Street, Miami, Florida, stated that her husband is a member of the Executive Board of JURE at Miami, and that he was then in Central America. She said in approximately June, 1963 her husband had traveled alone from Miami to Dallas, Texas, to set up a delegation of JURE in that city, and to her knowledge no other JURE member had gone to Dallas from Miami since that time. She said she could think of no JURE member named LEOPOLDO.

She advised that the JURE chapter in Dallas is JOSEF RODRIGUEZ ALVARADO, 1919 Llewellyn, Apartment A, Dallas. She said Mr. RODRIGUEZ would have knowledge of any JURE members visiting that city.

Interviews at Miami, Florida, were also conducted pursuant to information that ERWIN L. STENG of Garland, Texas, had advised that an individual believed identical with LEE HARVEY OSWALD had attended a meeting

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of the Student Directorate of Cuba, held in Dallas, Texas, at 8 PM on October 13, 1961. It was further advised that a guest register obtained at that meeting had been forwarded to Miss ANA SILVEIRA of the Student Directorate at Miami, Florida.

MISS ANA SILVEIRA, age 28, 1309 Bicknell Avenue, Miami, Florida, a member of the Directorate Revolucionaria Internacional (DRI - International Revolutionary Directorate or International Directorate of Cuba), advised that she had gone to Dallas, Texas, from Miami, Florida, for an open meeting of the DRI in that city, held on October 13, 1963. She stated that on October 13, 1963 a meeting for Spanish speaking persons was held at about 1 PM in the Decatur Club, Dallas, and she estimated about 70 persons attended this meeting.

She said a second meeting was held at 8 PM, October 13, 1963 in a conference room over a bank in a shopping center at Dallas, and this meeting was for English speaking persons, and she estimated about 30 attended. She stated that these meetings had previously been advertised at Dallas in order to give the interested public an opportunity to hear discussions by DRI members of the Cuban situation.

Miss SILVEIRA stated at the meeting on the evening of October 13, 1963 a sheet of paper was passed among those in attendance and those who were interviewed in receiving the bi-weekly English language publication THE CUBAN REPORT, which is composed by the DRI in Miami, and requested to furnish their names and addresses. She stated she also made note of the names of those individuals present who made contributions to the DRI at the meeting.

Miss SILVEIRA stated she had the list at the office of the WFO in Miami, and she was relatively certain that the name of LEO MARNEY OSWALD was not included in the list. She further stated she has seen many

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photos of OSWALD since the assassination, and is relatively certain he was not among those present at the meeting.

On December 23, 1963, Miss SILVEIRA was contacted at the DRI office, 1705 S.W. 3rd Avenue, Miami, Florida, at which time she was available to the list of those who attended the meeting in Dallas on the evening of October 13, 1963. This is a typewritten list and Miss SILVEIRA explained that she had disposed of the original paper bearing the names and addresses which had been passed in the audience at Dallas.

Miss SILVEIRA pointed out that the last nine names on the list were the names of individuals who attended a meeting by the DME at Fort Worth, Texas, held at approximately 5 PM on October 20, 1963 at a hotel near Fort Worth on the expressway running from Fort Worth to Dallas. Miss SILVEIRA said this meeting was also for English speaking persons and had been requested by Mrs. W. A. LANZER, 5309 Rutland, Fort Worth, who had attended the meeting on October 13, 1963 at Dallas.

Joaquin Martinez is Piniellos, age 22, stated he is in charge of publishing THE GUNN REPORT for the DME, 1705 S.W. 3rd Avenue, Miami, Florida. He stated that Mrs. SILVEIRA, KATHLEEN SAWYER, the latter an officer of the DME, and himself, traveled from Miami to Dallas, Texas, in October, 1963 for the purpose of holding public meetings to inform those interested of the work the DME has done and hopes to do with respect to the GASTRO regimen in Cuba. Mr. PINIELLOS stated that LEAN HERRING, 11022 Germaine Drive, Dallas, Texas, assisted the DME in organizing the meetings and arranging the publicity attached to the meetings.

He said this publicity included an appearance on a television station at Dallas, and also contact with the DALLAS MORNING STAR, a daily newspaper published in Dallas.

Mr. PINIELLOS stated Miss SILVEIRA and himself addressed the English speaking audiences which attended the DME meetings. He said that in addition to the meeting on the evening of October 13, 1963, in Dallas, two meetings were held at the University of Dallas, one at Southern Methodist University, Dallas, and one at some High School in Dallas. He estimated that at the meetings held in Dallas on October 13, 1963, approximately 50 to 60 persons attended the afternoon session, which was addressed by KATHLEEN SAWYER, and approximately 25 to 30 attended the evening session. He stated at neither of these meetings did any one in the audience attempt to bring up any debate or question. He said that he did not give any close observation to any of the English speaking persons present on the evening of October 13, 1963, and therefore could not state whether LEE HANLEY COTMAN may have been present.

18: September or October is vastly different than what Odio was ultimately persuaded to say, Sept 24 or 25. This pretty much coincides with the Time Hall and Seymour were in Dallas and coincides with what I learned from the Castorrs. I suggest we think in terms of it having been in October and see where that may lead us. I have earlier written comments on what I learned of the October meetings.

What is interesting is that Liebeler saw fit not to include this in the documents illuminating his part of the work.

I find it interesting that there is nothing about ~~the~~ any others who may have addressed these meetings, nor the statements that these are the only ones, which could have been the case.

I can attribute no special significance to any of the names. The Castorrs mentioned Dean Perkins to me.

That Stieg could have erred is obvious. It is also obvious that no effort was made to find out if he was just honestly wrong or if there was anyone at that meeting who did look like LHO. By this time the FBI had many indications of one or more such people.
