I've seen nothing further about Oswald at Keesler.

I do not know the procedures used by the Marines with their Form 20s.

But I find myself wondering if what he was attached to, under remarks, meant while at Keesler.

I'm not now sure but I think that when I was in the Army that Oswald was transferred to HQ, DC, meant he was being reassigned to a new or permanent station. Not to HQ.

I think this can be taken to mean that Keesler was not aware of the coming assignment of LHO. But I'm not sure.

As I think back now I'm still wondering why so few records remain of any training for jobs that required so high a security clearance.

It would seem to me that not just Oswald but for all Marines or others trained for the kind of job for which he was, the school would have kept more info.

I think that most of the Keesler training in control work was tower control. It happens that a few weeks ago I heard from a younger relative who took training at Keesler and became a control tower operator. Within the next year he'll probably be here and I'll see if he can shed any knowledge.
