Dear Mr. Kleindienst,

Because of your recent request to Mr. Tschetverikoff, I assure you that the subject of this letter is not in litigation and I would prefer that it not reach that stage. I write you because, under the law, you are the person I am required to address.

Bennie Gaire, then of New Orleans, was an associate of Sergio Arcacha Smith and others who figured in the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy. Lee Harvey Oswald also applied to him for a job. Oswald had Gaire's office address marked in his addressbook. Gaire and Arcacha ran an anti-Castro, fund-raising organization that used an address Oswald also used. Arcacha was the New Orleans head of an organization established, directed and financed by the CIA.

Gaire's office address was then the eighth building, at the corner of Camp and Canal Streets, New Orleans. His home address was 810 Dumaine Street. This address his organization ("The Crusade to Free Cuba"), Oswald and Arcacha will used to 840 Camp Street, which is identical with a side entrance used by the FBI to mark this address, 821 Lafayette Street.

Gaire claim to have been interrogated for 100 hours. The National Archives says it has a single FBI report or even reference to him. I request copies of all relevant docs. I presume it sufficient here being denied the Warren Commission and would refer to believe it is misfiled somewhere.

Gaire's home address is less than two short blocks from Dumaine and Decatur, where Tavel violated the curfew law in the early summer of 1968, a further intriguing coincidence, in view of his fugitive. In the course of its investigation, which was not for law-enforcement purposes, the FBI obtained a copy of the last check then distributed, identified a fingerprint on it as not Gaire's, i.e., if it were true the Warren Commission made fingerprint it was, I were not able to find no record of it. I therefore ask if this fingerprint was that of anyone in any way connected with the assassination investigation. I would like to know whom it is, for there are also those who should have been connected w/ the investigation and appear not to have been.

Would you desire that I submit some, of course, I will. However, I do hope most unusual circumstances can be dispensed with unless and until such is compelled by law or by.
