

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date, December 5, 1963.

Mr. L. BRIGGS, owner of the New Orleans Printing Company, 811 Camp Street, was reinterviewed at which time he stated that the two men who had come into his shop several months ago and were highly interested by COMMUNIST in passing out literature in front of the International Trade Mart might well have been RAFAEL (LNU) and ROBERTO MARTINEZ MASTROPIRE. He said from his recollection, he thought the above two men were the men who had come into his shop, but he said he saw so many Cubans and Spanish speaking men who were referred to him by the Oceana Inn, 820 Camp Street, because they cannot speak English, he cannot keep them straight in his mind and he said he may have made a mistake. He said he could suggest no other possibilities as to the identity of the two men who had come into his shop and told him about COMMUNIST passing out literature in front of the International Trade Mart.

Father ANTHONY, Oceana Inn, 820 Camp Street, advised on December 5, 1963, that he knew a Cuban sailor named RAFAEL HUGO PROMETA who came from New York, he thought, and who was a longshoreman and seaman. He said PROMETA was the RAFAEL referred to by Mr. L. BRIGGS of the New Orleans Printing Company because he said he had discussed this matter with BRIGGS. Father ANTHONY said PROMETA always stayed at the Oceana Inn when he was in New Orleans and said that his recollection indicated that PROMETA left on May 26, 1963 after saying he was to sail on a ship to Japan. PROMETA returned to New Orleans on October 16, 1963 and on the 15th and 17th of October stayed at the Oceana Inn. Father ANTHONY said PROMETA had indicated to him that he had a job on some ship in Tokyo. At this present time, he said he had no idea where PROMETA could be at the present time. He said this due to the fact that PROMETA was with the Cuban Longshoremen's Union and was known to have left the United States on October 16, 1963.
