ticklers

By means of attached 60-109060-4373 I amplify my prior appeal. I believe that FBI's ability to make instant retrieval of information - particularly of information not provided to me in the form of the underlying records - is further indication of the existence of ticklers also not provided. I believe further that the names listed on this record include those whom need included such ticklers.

You will recall that when the FBI did not set up a date for me to examine the JFK accommodation photographs I requested copies of all, that when I received no response I appealed and that you have not acted on that appeal.

You will also recall, I believe, that my film requests go back to 1/1/68 when I requested copies of the Doyle, Martin (Minneapolis) and WCCO-TV films. I have just recently received a copy of the Doyle film when it was made available to a later requester. The records I provide you refer to Oswald and two young men passing out leaflets on August 9, 1963.

As the attached record confirms, Oswald had two young men helping him on August 16, when Oswald also arranged for KDFW and WNB to film him leafleting outside the Clay Shaw Trade Mart. One man identified as Charles Bill Steele, Jr. The other cannot be any of those identified in most stills made of this film because they are not "young men" and because the photographer, Julian Bush, told the FBI they were not involved in handing out the leaflets (In one report the FBI gives the name as "Bart".)

My prior appeals include the still photographs made from the TV footage. The FBI did not give the Warren Commission copies of all such stills.

What makes this new interesting is the language "There was one individual... with Lee Harvey Oswald whom we were not able to identify" and "A New Orleans television station photographed this activity by Oswald and the two associates... all those in the existing film were identified. The two others are not young men and named Alice and Sam. Both had export-import businesses in the Trade Mart and can be seen leaving that building.
