In the course of checking something the other day, I notice in Bringuier's testimony (10H39) that he also knew LHO had two helpers at the ITM. This means that Quiroga saw two men helping him. It also means that Quiroga was able to ascertain that they were not merely spectators. With every indication of at least two helping him, it is remarkable the FBI was never able to learn who the other man was. And we now know they checked this before the ass, at the time it happened they had an ongoing investigation of LHO.

Liebelr gets B to identify Pizzo 453-A as the one he was shown. It is unlikely he was shown this one or this one alone in any effort to spot the third man. It is also unlikely that there is no still of this third man.

Interestingly, B says he told this to the SS (10H46), where, in the course of time, I will follow up.

The skill of all federal investigators in avoiding detection and identification of this man is spectacular.

I shall continue my efforts to get the missing prints. WDSU does not have them. If Pan speaks to Johann again, it might be a good idea to ask him if he noticed this person and, if he did, to get a description, as best he can recall after so long a time - and if he recalls any Feebee reaction when they saw the stills. It is a very long shot, but if you can find some Thornley pictures that do not have his name, and in which, as he often did, he looks like different people, that would be worth trying. Or, if he thinks he might be able to recall or tell whether a picture might suggest who it was, I'll get some and send to you. Turner was sent to see Rush for these stills, I was tracking them that long ago.
