

Lead on JFK Slaying Ignored

HOUSTON — A newspaper said yesterday the Warren Commission ignored a state attorney general's suggestion that all CIA and FBI agents in Dallas at the time of President John F. Kennedy's death be questioned to see if they knew Lee Harvey Oswald.

The Houston Chronicle said the suggestion by Waggoner Carr, now an Austin lawyer, also called for interrogation of every CIA or FBI informant, spy, double agent, and undercover agent in the area.

The Warren Commission report concluded that Oswald alone killed Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas.
