First, this report indicates the existence and Federal
possession of pictures and in the originals or files. They are
potentially very important, for example, in showing other people,
in showing David's close associates, people who knew him
and he might have been on his return to N.Y.

Coporan figures in the "Fairy" report, later said
to have been an error but he entirely consistent with David
Lecroix, as an experienced lawman, Coporan would have known
of David's whereabouts. He is now at WBSU-TV Channel 5 in
NYC, where he is News Director. Ken Dick-Donley left N.Y.
in November 1967, when the local NBC-Garrison-Sheridan
situation was getting hot, he went not to L.A. but to Coporan's
employer, where he was as of last week.

As to analysis of the nature of the documents, this
sound film, of best film quality, having been made in a studio,
could be very important in identifying David. It is one of the
very few, perhaps the only professional and professional-
quality pictures of him available. Never ever referred to.
The court files will likely contain such quality pictures and the
files of a pretty number of others, some of them, like Whitert,
might be of interest. Certainly the "with Brinkman, etc. Brin-
kman's name, this incident, is not once mentioned in these
reports, a remarkable omission.

Note SS possession of film not in archives or testimony.

If Voebel had old David pictures, it is likely he
had but one: he should be seen.
