If that alone gets printed Mailer will not live long enough to forget it, please believe me.

I was so disgusted when I read that I dropped other things and went into it when I was so upset about such unconscionable abuse of the dead. Who also was completely innocent of what Mailer made up.

If you would like to read it, and you know what my typing and writing <sup>are</sup> is, I'll send you a copy.

You should be upset, deeply upset.
