### Marina Oswald Widow Insists Her Husband Did Not Kill Kennedy

Lee Harvey Oswald's widow recently made her first visit to the scene of President John F. Kennedy's assassination and reiterated her claim that her husband did not shoot him.

Marina Oswald Porter, 54, says in the May issue of Ladies Home Journal that she once believed her husband killed Kennedy, but she started to have doubts when Congress reopened its investigation of the 1963 assassination in 1978.

"Lee never fired a shot," she said. Echoing her husband's own words before he was killed by Jack

Ruby, she said, "He was a patsy."

In Dallas, Porter visited the former Texas School Book Depository, from which Oswald allegedly fired the fatal shot. She also went to the infamous grassy knoll, where, some people believe, the shot that killed Kennedy was fired by a hidden gunman.

The Warren Commission concluded that Oswald was the lone killer, but a second congressional study said the assassination was probably the result of a conspiracy. NBC plans a TV movie based on Porter's life later this year.
