Oswald girls sue National Enquirer

ROCKWALL, Texas (UPI) — The two daugh-ters of accused presi-dential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald have filed a lawsuit against the Mational Enquire the National Enquirer, contending it portrayed them as social outcasts shunned by neighbors.

The libel suit filed by June Porter, 20, and her 18-year-old sister, Rachel, seeks unspeci-fied damages to com-pensate for the "shame, embarrassment, humillation and mental pain and anguish" they suffered as a result of a June 22 article in the weekly tabloid.

The young women, who took their stepfather's name, say the article portrayed them as social outcasts villified by their neighbors and shunned by their communities since childhood because their father was accused of killing President John F. Kennedy, when in fact they "have enjoyed a good reputation gen-erally."

Rachel lives with her Hachel lives with her mother, Marina Oswald Porter, and stepfather, Kenneth Porter, in Rockwall, 56 km (35 miles) east of Dailas and plans to attend col-lege in the fall. Her older sister, June, is a liournalism student at journalism student at the University of Texas at Austin
