

Oswald Widow Sues U.S.

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—Mrs. Marina N. Oswald Porter, the widow of the man the Warren Commission named as the assassin of President John F. Kennedy, has sued the U.S. government for \$500,000 as compensation for the government's seizure of Lee Harvey Oswald's personal effects. Mrs. Porter listed more than 200 items, ranging from hunting knives to a billfold to shirts and sweaters, as having belong to Oswald at the time of his death.
