DALLAS (AP) — The brother of Lee Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of President John F, Kennedy, is suing CBS, Inc. for \$500,000 for allegedly violating his constitutional rights in the recent broadcast of the film "For Days in Dallas."

Robert Oswald, a 46-year-old Wichita Falls salesman, said the made-for-television movie about the events immediately before and after the president's assassination, "appropriated and commercially exploited his name and character and invaded his right to privacy." He asked U.S. District Judge Robert Porter for a jury trial.

The suit said Oswald suffered humiliation, public scorn, embarrassment and ridicule, as well as severe mental and emotional distress, as a direct result of the movie.
