Dear Paul,

I have just discovered a misfiled copy of a WC cross-reference sheet you gave me long ago. It is to Oswald- Post Russian 2-3, with the two lines below having parallel lines close together in the printed form and your note relating to the second of these saying "This line reads 'American Civil Liberties Union'. I presumably refers to some parts of pages 36-41 of CD365, which are withheld".

The identification is of "Book containing information on Oswald", from "State of Louisiana Dept. Public ???", apparently the state police file? Or Welfare?

Anyway, finding this at this juncture makes me wonder if, in the light of knowledge we have obtained since then, you can relate this to anything, including the reasons for withholding, and whether there could be anything here involved that relates to current interests, like Quiroga, Ferris, etc.

Do the pages preceding or following yield any kind of clue, if you now have any way of knowing?
