On April 7, 1967, I spoke to MRS. RUTH E. LUCAS. Mrs. LUCAS worked at the Napoleon Street Branch of the Public Library starting in September, 1963. She recalls checking out one book for LEE HARVEY OSWALD. The book was "Brave New World" by Aldous Huxley. As Mrs. LUCAS recalls, OSWALD was by himself and the date was about September 19, 1963. OSWALD was rather curt to her and this is the reason she recalls this particular incident. Mrs. LUCAS also stated that all of the books checked out by OSWALD were returned on time.
