### DOCTOR TELLS OF HEARING TALK ABOUT JFK PLOT

Madison, Wis., Feb. 2 (AP)—The Madison Capital Times quoted a young resident physician yesterday as asserting that a patient in a Mandeville, La., hospital had said, four days before the assassination of President Kennedy, that he "knew of a plot to kill the President."

Dr. Wayne Owen was quoted as saying the unidentified man, one of three whom Louisiana state police had brought to the hospital as presumed drunks after an auto accident, had told a group of 11 medical students, including Owen, that "Jack Rubenstein" was involved in the plot.

Owen said that the students "just laughed it off" at the time but that when the President was assassinated, they took their story to New Orleans police. However, he said, they were unable to identify the patient and the man's records unaccountably could not be found later in the files at Jackson Memorial hospital.
