

## Woman Who Befriended Oswald Due Before Orleans Jury Today

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — A Texas woman who befriended the family of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald was under court orders to appeal Thursday before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

Mrs. Ruth Paine of Irving, a Dallas suburb, was ordered by Texas District Judge John Mead last week to cooperate with the jury probing the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

She did not contest the subpoena from the office of Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison, who contends that Oswald and others conspired here in the summer of 1963 to assassinate Kennedy.

The official Warren Commission named Oswald as the lone assassin of President Kennedy in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Mrs. Paine was a close friend of Marina Oswald, wife of Lee Harvey Oswald. She said last month she had nothing to add to the investigation conducted by Garrison.

Garrison's subpoena stated that Mrs. Paine transported Oswald's rifle—which the Warren Commission said was the murder weapon of Kennedy—when she helped the family move to Dallas from New Orleans in 1963.
