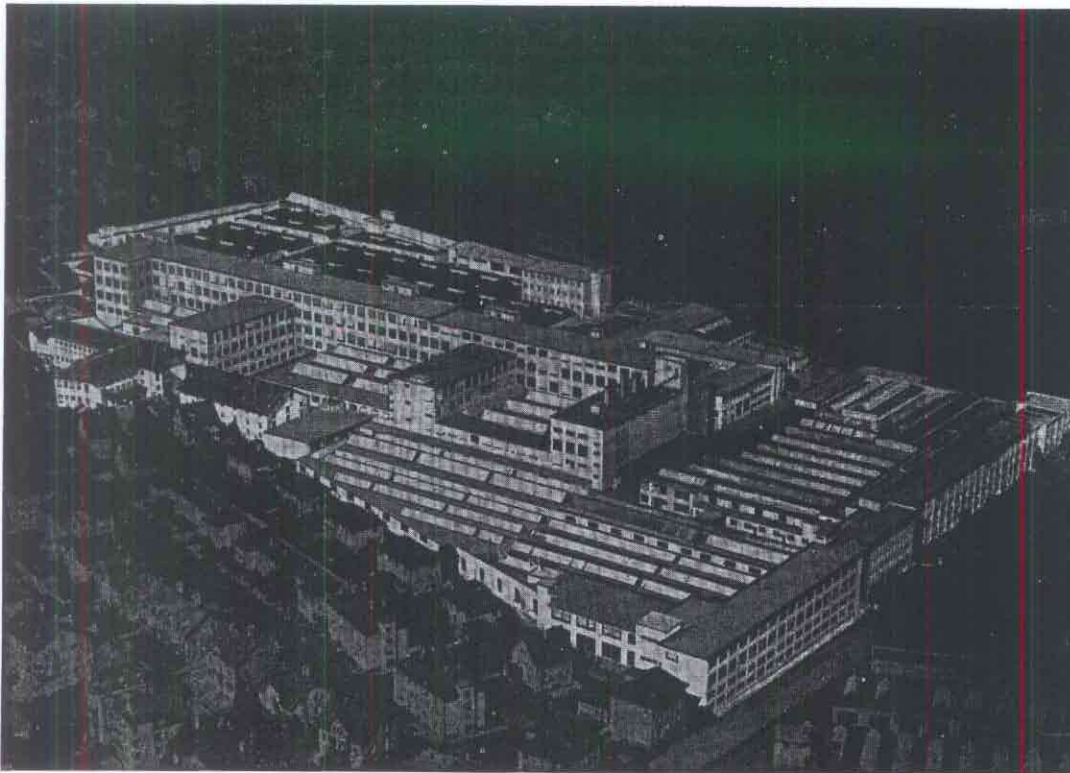


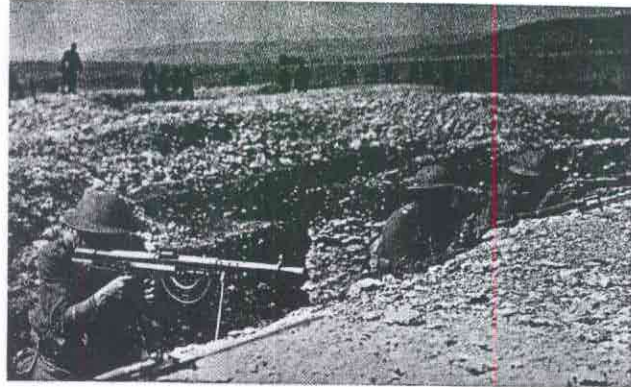
Figure 21-8. Aerial view of the Oerlikon factory in Switzerland.
