You are, no doubt, familiar with the two medical reports released by your department the might before the heaving in Judge Kelleck's court on the action brought by New Orleans District Atterney Jim Gerrison in his successful petition to have access to the pictures and X-rays of the successful Fresident Kennedy made available to him. These metical reports were mide to your department by the autopay surgeons in 1967 and by a special penal conversed by your department, in 1968, and, is final form, were filed in court.

I am writing to request access to the raw metaricle of these reports. By this I mean motes, rough dwafts, final panel drafts, individual reports by any of the panel members or advisors and relevant correspondence and memorands, etc. If, as i have reason to believe, the report of the special panel was edited, it would like to know by whom and on whese orders. By "panel" hare, I mean both groups, and by notes and memorands, I also mean to include any minutes of their mettings, deliberations, comments, etc. In the event some of this was verbal, I also would like engthing committed to paper as a result or in persuance of requests not made in writing and responses. If either panel made requests for evidence sither denied or not made eveilable and there is no written record, I hope you will enquire into this, because of the nature of the subject, and tell met wast was not made aveilable, by whose decision or erder, and ways

If you will look into this, you will find that material described above was note public by your department when it suited departmental purposes or ennumience.

I would like to be able to examine these files and, if they are useful in my writing and research, parhaps obtain electrosistic copies of parts.

Because it may slip your mind, i take the liberty of reminding you that the "Freedom of Information wet" does re uire prompt response. A more in this instance it will be done.
