Q. What is the true story of President Kennedy's assassination? Is it true that one of the death bullets went through the front of Kennedy's neck? — Mrs. Russell Drown, Lubbock, Tex. A. All three bullets fired by Lee Harvey Oswald were

fired from behind and above the President. The autopsy X-rays show that conclusively. There is no evidence that there was more than one assassin. Handprints taken from the stock of the rifle found in the Texas School Depository show that Oswald fired the rifle. No knowledgeable doctors at any time said Kennedy had been shot through the front of the neck. The book Rush to Judgment, by Mark Lane, which contends otherwise, is in error. The author represents the mother of Lee Harvey Oswald. Members of the Warren Commission differed strongly, at times almost violently, on how the report should be prepared, written and released. But never at any time did the commission suppress any evidence. The conclusions of the Warren Commission report, based on the evidence, are valid and will stand the test of history.
