Is it possible the P-M picture wes taken from the third floor of the Dal-Tex Bldg, the pindows South of the fire escape? Hers Dickis judgement woukd be very goad. He checked my guspeions out whon he made his first trip to Dall as and had similar ones. As I recell it, he found it impossible to get into that pert of the second floor.

AI Chapman tonk meny pictures for me from many places. I belleve he told me the only place to which he was denied access was the second noor, same erea. This, of course, makes tha $\ddagger$ pert mors interesting. If it ever becomes important and we can do it no other way, I think comparison WIth Chapman's pictures, which are identified by camere location, nould meke this possible.

I'm a little logey today. Early this moming, ofter taking a few exercises before retiring, I sudaenly lost some oi my sense of belance. I'm still mitx a little that wey.

If you have not already seen the enclosed picture, I am sure that you will find it fascinating, especially in conjunction with the caption below it. I uncovered the picture while I was glancing through old copies of the French magazine, Paris-Match. It occurs in an edition that was issued earley in December, 1963; Paris-Match's special on the assassination.

As I wrire this I do not have any Dealey Plaza photos before me, so it is hard for me to determine exactly, but it appears that the picture was snapped at or very near the second floor window of the Dal-Tex bullaing that you pointed to in connection with the Altgens photo-- i.e., your aiscussion of the object that is evident in the window and of the man on the fire escape who seems severely agitated.

THE PICTURE AND CAPTION INDICATE

* that very soon after the assassination somebody caused the Paris-Match photographer to believe that the firing was done from the second floor window of the Dal-Tex.

Except in the light of your disclosures about the Dal-Tex window, I woula have considered the Paris-Match picture simply a newsman's blunder. But now the picture amazes me, for it was published long before you called attention to the window, and at a time when nearly everybody, incluaing the writers at Paris-Match, believed that the shots came from the Depository.

I do not know from whom the Paris-Match photographer might have gotten the notion that shots came from the second floor of the Dal-Tex builuing. It would be interesting to know exactly when the picture was taken.

Paris-Match also published a color version of the Zapruder frame that I sent to you recently, the one that I thought might show the wound at JFX's right temple. The white patch that is eviaent in the black and white picture is not the President's wound, nor is it the hend of JFK or of Mrs. Kennedy. Frankly. I can!'t make out what it is, Elthough the picture is unusually clear. It's just a white splotch. The picture should show JFK's right profile (his ear is clearly visible), but instead it just shows a white splotch.

I am sending a copy of this letter and the Paris-Match Dal-Tex photo to Dick Sprague.
