Partin, Dunham Free on Bond

BATON ROUGE (AP) — Two men under federal indictment for anti-trust violations and extortion today were free on personal recognizance bonds.

U.S. Dist. Court Judge E. Gordon West yesterday set aside a requirement for \$25,000 property bonds for Ted Dunham Jr. and Edward Partin who were indicted on five counts each by a grand jury in New Orleans last week.

Partin is business agent for Teamsters Local No. 5 in Baton Rouge. Dunham is an officer in three firms named in the indictment.

The indictment charges that Dunham and Partin acted to put Dunham's business rivals out of competition.
