Dear Senator Hatch:

An article appeared in the St. Louis Globe-Democrat relating to your views on this country's investigative agencies fast approaching a "zero security society".

During the early 1970's I worked as an informer for the F. B. I. and in 1978, I did the same for the House Select Committee on Assassinations.

Enclosed is a letter and attachments which I have recently given to the United States Attorney in St. Louis, Robert D. Kingsland.

In theory, intelligence agencies must be guided by constitutional rights afforded each citizen-but I don't think, as an operative of these two organizations, that these civil rights are protected in the realities of these governmental agencies investigative practices.

The enclosures are only a sampling of over 1500 pages of which I have not as yet had time to scrutinize individually.
