

**Five Letters Are Stolen  
From Peace Now Office  
Include Copies of Those Sent  
to Hoover and Lindbergh**

Bessie Simon, secretary of the Peace Now Movement, with headquarters at 15 East Fortieth Street, reported to police of the East Thirty-fifth Street station yesterday that copies and originals of letters to and from prominent persons in connection with the organization's affairs had been stolen from the movement's office.

Miss Simon said five letters

were taken, including one from Senator Burton K. Wheeler, Democrat, of Montana, and copies of letters sent to former President Herbert Hoover, Charles A. Lindbergh and General Robert Wood.

Miss Simon said she informed the police on advice of Dr. George W. Hartmann, professor of educational psychology at Teachers College, Columbia University, and a visiting lecturer at Harvard University, who is chairman of the Peace Now Movement. Detective William O'Keefe, of the East Thirty-fifth Street station, said he was investigating. He said Miss

Simon reported she had not seen the missing letters for two months and could not say when they were taken. They had been placed in a box on a shelf. Miss Simon said she missed them for the first time Monday afternoon. More than \$100 in a near-by desk drawer was untouched, Detective O'Keefe reported.
