Gradually a picture is emerging., I do not think the government expects this case to go to court or, if it does, to win. I think its objectives are of another kind.

I very much more that some day in the not distant future it will be possible for as to be together again, for various reasons, and I can then explain.

It is not writing that is keeping me so busy. Inhave not been able to work on any books for several weeks. It is other things, one that may involve the life of a prominent man against whom a threat has been made. Some official people do not trust the opinion of the federal experts that it is without meaning (which may be the case) and have asked my help.

I think you can understand and know me well enough to know that even though I have no income and can hope for any only through writing, I feel " must do what I can.
