Dear Orest,

I have a few moments now and may not later, so I write briefly to tell you that there was more investigation of you by the FBI than I earlier knew. I am getting a copy of a letter by Hoover recommending that you be called before the Commission because of alleged conflicts in what you are said to have said and because you allegedly refused to cooperate. I will be sending these things to you, as I have other.

At least part of the investigation of you was by an agent named Morrissey. I do not recall his name, nor do I recall your mentioning it. Possibly he was selected because you didn't know him. But in early July, Hoover told the Commission their investigation of you was continuing.

I think this also can explain the way you were treated by the Commission. I wonder if in part it was not intended as a build-up for Bringuler, for his word to be taken over yours, etc., and for you just not to be believed. I'll be thinking about this more and when I have all these documents I'll go over them again and, if I have any other opinion, will include it. Meanwhile, if you have any ideas about it, let me know.

However you look at it, somebody didn't like you!

From the records it is arranged to appear that it was not deBrueys or, in fact, it may not have been him and he may have been doing what he was told. Here again, I just do not know.

If I do not get these things in a few days, I'll mail this, so you can know and possibly be thinking about it, and then will send the rest when I can do it.
