Bourbon Street vice kingpin William "Rick" Colacurcio Jr. posted a \$100,000 cashier's check as bond less than a half-hour after his arraignment on racketeering charges Friday.

Colacurcio, 57, was arraigned before U.S. Magistrate Ingard O. Johannesen, who set the \$100,000 bond after Colacurcio stated he is self-employed as a bar owner. Colacurcio gave as his address 522 Bourbon St., and said he has approximately \$100,000 in bank accounts and about \$185,000 in local real estate.

Colacurcio's attorney for the arraignment, Ed Castaing, asked Johannesen not to remand Colacurcio to jail because he intended to post the bond. Johannesen said Colacurcio would remain in jail until he posted the bond, and about 20 minutes later his son, Rick Colacurcio III, arrived with the cashier's check.

FBI agents verified the check, and Colacurcio was released. He will be represented at trial by local criminal trial attorney F. Irvin Dymond. Johannesen set a preliminary hearing for June 21:

A complaint filed against Colacurcio by the federal Organized Crime and Racketeering Strike Force alleges 13 overt acts in violation of the Racketeer Influence and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) statute. The complaint alleges Colacurcio paid three undercover New Orleans police officers and one FBI agent 10 bribes totaling \$3,600 between

Jan. 29 and April 17 to protect his alleged gambling operation.

Accused of bribing police in the same complaint as Colacurcio are Dinos Rallis, who identified himself Friday in court as Constantios Rallis, 42, and Theodoros "Teddy" Dimopoulas. 27.

The three allegedly ran a gambling operation on the second and third floors of 523 Iberville St., in the Greek-Italian Association Club. The club was raided at the same time police and FBI agents rounded up more than 100 prostitutes and panderers Thursday night.

Johannesen set a \$200,000 bond for Dimopoulas Friday, and a \$100,000 bond for Rallis. Neither had posted bond late Friday. Rallis gave as his address 523 Iberville, the club's location. Dimopoulas listed his address as 601 Iberville St. Neither is a U.S. citizen.

Rallis is charged in the complaint with paying one bribe of \$40 to officer Wilben Tank on Jan. 20. Dimopoulas is accused of paying a \$50 bribe to Tank on March 3.

Colacurcio is accused of bribing officer John Kastner on 10 occasions, usually in amounts of \$300.

Also arrested on RICO charges and arraigned Friday before Johannesen were:

— Orestes Pena, 55, 6100 Argonne Blvd., accused of paying 12 bribes to Kastner totaling \$3,400 between Sept. 6, 1978, and Jan. 16. He described himself as being in the real estate business and claimed to own four bars — two on Decatur Street — worth a total of \$214,500. He said he had about \$40,000 in the bank. Johannesen set his bond at \$75,000 and commented, "Seventy-five is kind of light." Pena posted a surety bond.

 Amelia "Amy" Rodriguez, 46, a native of Puerto Rico, 5862 Seaguil Lane, described herself as owner of the

McGinty, totaling \$3,475 since last October. Johannesen set bond at \$100,000, which was not made.

- Paulino Lopez, a native of Cuba. 46, 4628 Reich St., Metairie, owner of Los Amantes (The Lovers) bar, 121 Decatur St. He claimed to have \$4,000 in the bank and a home worth \$50,000. Lopez is charged with paying 16 bribes to Kastner and Brink totaling \$2,600.

Lopez. according to the complaint, first discussed the payments last November during a meeting with Kastner and Brink at his bar. Local real estate records show Lopez sold half-interest in his bar to City Council fiscal officer Louis Gomez in January.

Johannesen set Lopez' bond at \$75,-000, which Lopez later posted.

— Maria Christina Rubio, 39, of Honduras, 2165 Treasure St., a barmaid at Los Amantes, was charged with bribing Kaster on five occasions, totaling \$775. Johannesen set her bond at \$50,000. She said she has no money.

— Ramon Fernandez, 33, a native of Spain, 4645 Yale St., Metairie, identified himself as a carpenter with \$100 in cash and \$300 in the bank. He is described by authorities as an employee at Los Amantes and is accused of making three bribery payments to Kastner and Brink totaling \$525. His bond was set at \$50,000, and he later posted it.

If convicted, each of the nine could receive a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison and a fine of \$25,000 for each charge.

Why did the undercover officers go on the trip with Gomez?

"The motive was simple," said one source. "We wanted to open the net a little bit more so the fish could swim in."

While the trip may have been an interesting sidelight during the investigation on Decatur and Bourbon streets, and provided a brief vacation for the cops, "it turned out to be an absolute zero as far as law enforcement was concerned," another source told The Times-Picayune.

Gomez coordinated the trip, inviting Pena and Rochon along, sources said. Paulino Lopez, who was reportedly in Cuba at the time, was also scheduled to meet with the group in Honduras, sources said, but these plans were never carried out.

As chief administrative officer, Rochon was assigned bodyguards to accompany him on the trip. Kastner and Brink were chosen for the job.

Gomez said Friday that the trip was an innocent one, and said it is the fourth year in a row he has arranged to take New Orleanians to LaCeiba, where he was born. He said 80 to 90 people went on the trip this year.

Gomez denied that he paid for anyone's expenses but his own. He said everyone paid his own way except Rochon, whose accommodations were provided by the Honduran government.

"It's a foul ball, this story. It's going to throw a bad light on something that's been very pretty between two cities," Gomez said.

"Somebody's going to connect Rochon on the trip along with Kastner and the vice squad and Louis Gomez, but certainly there is no connection," he said.

"It's one of those screwy things," he said, referring to the story. "Don't let anybody try to say this is some kind of mysterious trip."

Gomez said he sponsors the trip every year, and takes along civic leaders, Latin American community leaders, doctors, lawyers and a television crew.

Morial, asked Thursday night about his knowledge of Gomez' property relationship with the arrested Lopez, would not comment. He referred a reporter's inquiries to Gomez himself.

Morial, U.S. Attorney John Volz and NOPD Superintendent James Parsons also would not discuss the circumstances surrounding the trip to Honduras and what role it might have played in the nine-month long investigation at a Friday press conference.

"We'd rather not get into that," Volz said, after acknowledging that Gomez did, in fact, own a building that had been a prime location for the nightly gathering of prostitutes and pimps.

"We have no plans to prosecute Mr. Gomez," Volz added.

Early Friday, Gomez denied owning any interest in any Decatur bar. He told a reporter to check his facts because "all five of you (reporters) were wrong" in an article in Friday morning's paper.

"That's all I will say until I contact my attorney." Gomez said.

Records, however, show that Gomez and Lopez purchased the building which now houses the Los Amantes Bar for \$125,000 on Dec. 20, 1976.

Records also show that on Jan. 12, 1979, Lopez sold his half interest in the building to Gomez and Gomez's wife for \$7,500 cash. Lopez testified in federal court that he owned the "bar business," but not the building.

Confronted with that information later Friday, Gomez admitted that he owns the building. He denied, however,

that he had any knowledge of the prostitution activities allegedly going on in the bar or in \$5 "trick" rooms above it.

He characterized the Los Amantes as a "seaman's bar," and said he was aware of nothing going on there.

Asked if he ever visited the building, Gomez said, "Sure, I went there 10 or 15 times. I own the building."

Gomez said he bought the building because he hoped a nearby hotel would buy it. "My own idea is that the raid is going to up the value," he said.

"I certainly had nothing to do with this scandal. The only reason I'm responding now is because I was disturbed about how it was reported

Asked if he was now under "pressure" from the council because of his ownership of the building, Go.nez said, "Well, they want answers. That's it."

Gomez was appointed to his \$31,764 a year post with the council ir October 1078. The was formerly exactive as
