

JFK assassination records - Warren C. De Bruyn

The attached Not Recorded Serial from Section 106 of what I believe is 62-109060 (the number is unclear) refers to a record I have not seen, the transcript of an authorized CBS interview with the since retired then San Juan SAs De Bruyn. Earlier he had been an SA in New Orleans and is among those of special skills who were sent to Dallas.

Unfide and I are confident false charges had been made against De Bruyn by a man with whom he'd had some problems years earlier, Grant Parr. In essence Parr claimed to have seen De Bruyn and Oswald together.

All CBS aimed of the interview is a brief strip of film that was hardly more than a formal denial, no more than was necessary to avoid allegations of unfairness against CBS.

I believe that any fuller version is an historically important record because of the widespread attention given to the Parr allegation and because he was also a witness before the Schlesinger subcommittee of the Church committee. (I was unsuccessful in my efforts to get Parr to recall that he had given me a different version of a similar story in which De Bruyn did not figure. I believe I also indicated to Senator Schlesinger that the story had become mythology and was baseless.)

If Parr was a House investigating committee witness then there is added historical importance to the record and added reason for the full transcript of the interview to be available in fairness to De Bruyn and his family. Even if only at some distant future date.
