Penabes is surrently a publisher ("Insight on the News", Circulation 17,000) with strong anti-demonist and right wing predilections and connections. He was a lamper in Ouba (?) until 1962 when he seems to the U.S. Dr. Penabas speaks perfect English and seems to avoid "taking sides" in all of the Cuban groups, tho he is most familiar with a number of former Entista people. Penabas was never pro-Castro. He was a TV personality in Cuba until he left. He goes on lecture circuit in the US now.

Penabas believes that there was (1) more than a single assassin and (2) the assassination is intimately connected with Cube.

Penabas says that the murder of Miem (Oct. 1962) and company in South Vist Nom can be directly traced to JYK and the GIA. He says they were murdered like degs and this thinly veiled American capacity for political assessination made a great impression on Fidel and Company.

Shortly after Diem's murder, Endie Mavena breadcast a speech of Fidel's ade at the Brazilian Bubassy in Havena there Fidel noted the U.S. capacity for political murder and remarked 'it can be done to them as they do to others'.

Sometime thereafter (late 1962 or 1963) a large coffin was carried through the streets of Havena with a sign 'Here lies JFK; the Cuban Revolution killed him'. This scene was wirephotoed to the U.S. but only two newspapers printed it: New Hampshire Union Leader and Richmond Hows Leader.

Penabas believes that JFE signed his own Seath warrant at a speech in Elemi's Depost Place on Hovember 18, 1963. He pushed for Manelo Ray to succeed Fidel (this was known as "Fideliam without Fidel".

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Penabas does not think that Fidel personally had any role in the assassination: "too dangerous".

Benabas also does not believe that the "regular" rank and file anti-Castro's had anything to do with it as, according to him, they had never lost faith in JFK and his intentions to help free Cuba. He cites the April 1962, lst anniversary of the Bay of Figs when JFK made speech in Grange Bowl. [However, much happened in meantime, especially summer of 1963].

Penabar rejects completely the thesis that JFK and Fidel were amgotiating any sort of rapproachment. He insists JFK was working hard for Manelo Ray to replace Fidel; possibly could be correct and various "feelers" were just fru-fru.

According to Penabas, Oswald was a fanatical pro-Castro Communist, despite his disppointments in the USSR; see debate with Carlos Bringuier in New Gricans. He says that Oswald feebly attempted to infiltrate anti-Communist anti-Castro group in New Orleans (see meeting at Bringuier store).

The two most likely emplanations for the actual assassination, according to Penabas, are:

- Oswald and two or three ethers cooked up the whole scheme on their ewn; these could have been pro-Castre types in FFCC which had been anti-Kennedy for a long time.
- 2. Castro agents without Castro's personal knowledge

[Penabaz appears to reject Magell's thesis that the plotters were dissident anti-Castros who masqueraded as pro-Castros in order to Fedruit a pro-Castro patsy, i.e., Oswald.]

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In his testimony before the Warren Commission, Penabas said that he had heard that Castro's Air Ferce Chief (name?? had landed in Dallas in a Red Cessma on Movember 22, 1963, to pick up Cauald but that plans got fouled up when Oswald went home to change his clothes [This sounds a bit much]. Penabas

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slso says that , a Latin Communist, who stirred up trouble in samular and Tanganyika, was behind this gambit. Penabes also says that the Air Chief's #1 Aide defected about mid-1968 but was killed when his heliocopter cracked at Ear West.

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Very few Cuban emiles seem to know Sylvia Odio Herrera - something peculiar about this??

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Pensbas thinks that Ruby was the "executioner". He points to the fact that Claude Weltser and William Kuntsler were two of his lawyers "near the end". [See Rap Brown and other "Communists"].

Penabas asks about Mohert C. Wieha, CTA type who flitted in and out of Cubs for years. What happened to him?

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Penabas also mentioned Frank Picrini, a soldier of fortune in Miami who would know many of the Bay of Pigs (and possibly BRAVO) types - Not in phone book.

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Also mentioned:

CIA types in Mismi in 1963 were Fernande Caveda, Mario Seiglie, and Carlos Telles.

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FFCC was primarily American but one Santos Bush, Cuban, was a member and he got money from Raul RSA to put FFCC ad in New York Times.

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
