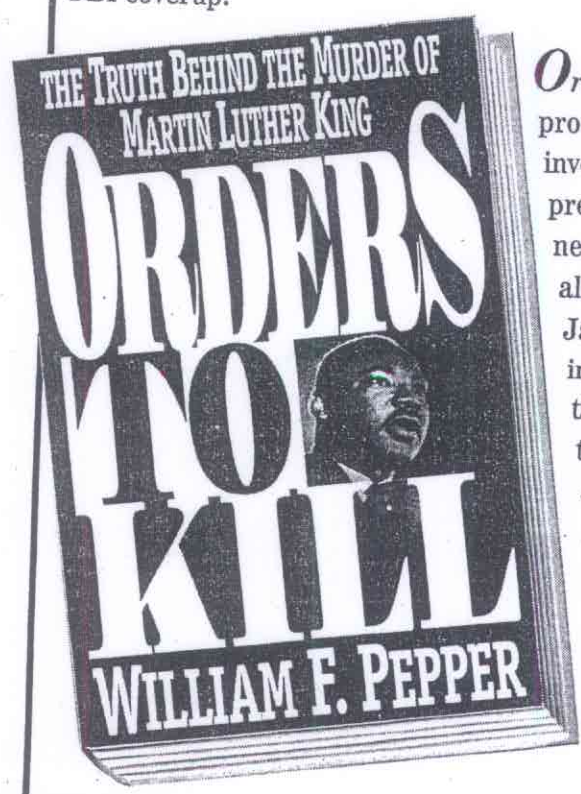


DID THE U.S. ARMY ORDER KING'S DEATH?
