Mrs. Mark E. Martin, if I am not in error, is Shirley Martin.

Without "the attached correspondence" with Dr. Perry, I can only theorize and speculate.

This is dated in May, months after Shirley knew there was a WC.

Is it possible she then initiated a correspondence with the SS?

Or, did Perry just give it to the SS?

If so, when? If not, when and why the delay? Did the WC ask for it?

And why, if he did it earlier, did the SS wait until May to forward to Rankin?

If this has not been looked at, possibly it might be, for the date is an odd one for the forwarding of correspondence that either should have been much earlier or given earlier to that of a different agency, like FBI.

Also, Shirley always lived in chaos, never could find anything. She had an enormous stack of stuff in her garage. She had great difficulty finding clipings for me, and I never got one that had been cut from the paper, just torn out and, it then seemed, never filed.

She once had a tape of her interview with Father Miber. She couldn't find it when I asked her for it. She thought she loaned it to Mark. It is possible her correspondence contains contemporaneous comment on what she had been told by those she then (almost immediately) interviewed.
