Belaunde 'Happy' On N.Y. Arrival

Fernando Belaunde Terry, ousted president of Peru, flew into Kennedy Airport from Argentina this morning and declared, "I am happy to be in the United States."

He told a newsman, "I am feeling fine," then hurried off to greet a group of friends and former Peruvian officials, in-

cluding Celso Pator, former ambassador to the United States from Peru.

Belaunde's departure from Buenos Aires was preceded by his attempt to board a plane for Lima, Peru, where he hoped to confront the military junta which had ousted him last Thursday. He was dragged from the plane by Argentine Air Force men and later boarded the New Yorkbound Pan American jetlin-
