3 Peruvians Accused

LIMA—Documents charging fraud by three ministers of deposed President Fernando Belaunde Terry have been filed with the Supreme Court. The papers were signed by Gen. Juan Velasco Alvarado, head of the new military government.

The alleged fraud was in

connection with a contract related to the U.S. operated La Brea y Parinas oilfields in northern Peru. The signing of the contract with the International Petroleum Co., a subsidiary of Standard Oil of New Jersey, brought on an army-led coup that ousted Belaunde Oct. 3.

Accused of "fraud damaging to the state "were former Finance Minister Manuel Ulloa, Promotion Minister Pablo Carriquiry and Guillermo Hoyos. If found

guilty, they will face up to six years' imprisonment.
