Staff Sergeant JOHN EDWARD PIC, Air Force Serial Number AF 130 132 39, assigned to Wilford Hall Hospital, Medical Squadron, Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, who informed that he is a half brother to LEE HARVEY OSWALD, accused assessin of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, was interviewed at the Sacurity and Law Enforcement Division, Lackland Air Force Base.

Sergeant PIC said he was born January 17, 1932 at New Orleans, Louisiana. He said he joined the U. S. Coast Guard at age 18, in Dallas, Taxas. He thereafter entered the U. S. Air Force and from February 1, 1956 until 1958 was stationed at He tokell Air Force Base, Hempstead, New York. In 1958, he was transferred to Japan and from Hovember 10, 1958 until July 17, 1962, was stationed with the U. S. Air Force at Tachikawa, Japan. From there he was transferred to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, arriving at Lackland in August, 1962, since which time he has been Losigned to the Medical Squadron, Wilford Hall Hospital, Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, as indicated above. Sergean% PIC lives at 7305 Westville, San Antonio, Texas, with his wife and three small children.

Sergeant PIC stated his father was EDWARD JOHN PIC but that he does not know where or when his father was born nor whether he is living or not. He stated he does not runerber his father at all, it having been his understanding from his mother that they were separated when Sergeant PIC was an infant. He also believed his mother had mentioned that his father was a stevedore.

Sergeant PIC stated his mother's maiden name Was MARGUERITE CLAVERY and she was born in New Orleans, Louisiana, on July 19, year of birth unknown. He stated her first marriage was to his (Sergeant PIC's) father, EDWARD JOHN PIC, and that he was the only child born of this marriage. Sergeant PIC stated that, seconding to what he understood from his mother, she married, while Sergeant PIC was an infant, one ROBERT LEE EDWARD OSWALD, who died in August, 1939; and is buried someplace in New Orleans, Louisiana. To this marriage was born ROBERT

Surgeant PIC stated the last time he had seen or had any concast with LLE PANVEY OSUALD was on Thanksgiving Day of 1962 at the residence of ROBLET LEE EDWARD OSWALD, dk. in the 7000 block of the Anport Street, Fort Worth, Texas, as discussed in further stall neroinafter. Prior to that occasion, the last time Sargaant PIC had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD was in Pebruary, 1953. Sergeant PIC explained that in July or August, 1552, ne and his wife were living at 525 Heat Sind Street, New York, New York, and Sergeant PIC was at that time in the U. C. Whest Shard. He said his mother and LEE MARVLY OSWALD, them really lived with him at the latter address for about six weeks. Sergeant PIC stated he no longer has this letter of ROBERT LEE EDWARD OSWALL, MA. and can recall nothing further as to its contents but asserved that apparently LEE MARVEY OSWALD had discussed the matter of going to Russia with MOBERT LEE EDWARD OSMAID, Sec.

Sergeant PIC stated that he and his wife and shillern went to Fort Worth, Texas, in November 1952, to spend the Thanksgiving holidays with KOBERT LET EMARD USUALD and his family. At that time, ROBERT LEE EDWARD USUALD, JR, was living in the 7000 block of Davenport Streat in Fort Worth. Sergeant PIC said he and his family visited there from Thanksgiving Day, 1962 until the Following Sunday when they returned to San Antonio, Texas.

Sargeant PIC stated that on the morning of Thanksgiving Day, 1962, ROBERT LEE EDWARD OSWALD, JR. informed him that LEE MARVEY OSWALD and wife and infant daughter were also coming over and at about 1:00 or 2:00 p.m. that day Sergeant PIC and ROBERT went to the Craynound see Station in Fort Worth, Texas, met LEE EARVEY OSWALD and his family as they came out of the station, and took them to ROBERT's house. Sergeant PIC said he did not know where LEE HARVEY OSWALD and his family had come from, but presumed they had come over from ballas, Texas, as he believed they were living in Ballas at that time.

Sergeant PIC stated LEE HARVEY OSWALD, his

wile, LakINA, and their young daughter staved at NOBERT's house until asket (10) or 7:00 p.m. Thanksgiving Day, 10 2, at which then they left in company of a man, name uncount, and case by for them. PIC said he was told this man, which he was able to describe only as white, rather tall, dark here, dark complexion, possibly 25 to 28 yours old, was studying Russian at some school in the state of orlahome, possibly the University of Oklahoma. Fit bold this man was at RCHERT's house for only a raw minutes and, while he was introduced to him, he could not recall his name. Sorgeant PIC said he understood ROBERT had met this man previously and he believed ROBERT would know his name and possibly have additional information about him.

Sergeant PIC said that during the visit of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and family to ROBERT LEE EDWARD OSWALD, 1.15 residence in Fort Worth, Texas, on Thanksgiving Day, 162, Las MARVEY OSWALD had nothing to say about his experience in Aussia nor what impelled him to go there, other than to mention that he had worked in some kind of factory and ned "a hard time". He said LEE HARVEY CSWALD had nothing to say regarding any kind of politics, nor did helexpress his feelings about Communism. Neither did he mention that no had any membership in any Communist or any other kind of organization, according to Sergeant PIC, and, spacifically, Sorgeant PIC said LEE HARVEY OSWALD mentioned nothing accur the " Fair Flay for Cuba Committee". Sergeant PIC said ne was told LEE HARVEY USWALD's wife, MARINA, had been a pnarmacist in Russia but he stated she did not speak English and he accordingly learned nothing further from or about her. Sorgeant PIC said LEE HARVEY OSWALD did advise that he had a Post Office Box in Dallas, Texas, where letters could be sent to him and he said LEE HARVEY wrote the number of this Post Office Box down in a little nook which Sergeant PIC had. The Sergeant said he could not remember the number of the box and that he had given the little book to the U. S. Secret Service representative in Sea Antonio, Texas.

Sergeant PIC advised that his mother, in the years up to 1946, was quite close to her sister, Hrs. CHARLES ELECTT, who, as of 1946, was living at an address on Sherwood Forrest Drive in New Orleans, Louislana. He

Sorgaant PIC said he believed his cother's ducensed huseand, ROBIER LEE COWARD OSWALD, SR., had a brother, hARVEY COWALD, who years ago lived in New Orleans, Louisiana, but that he really did not know whether KARVEY OSWALD is still alive.

Sergeant PIC adivised he was unable to recall any other relatives of his mother.
