Doubleday referred my letter to Random House. I enclose the letter I got from them and my response. I do not expect any further response of any kind. But there is still a possibility of a public controversy.

Because of additional health reverses I have had prints made of the strip of 35mm contact prints I have of the curtains Oswald's room did not have *being put up.*

While in and of themselves they are exculpatory, they do not have to stand by themselves. With any attention at all they should create some stir. So I'll write a little about the official evidence that both confirms these pictures and is confirmed by them.

No book has yet exculpated Oswald, with all that means. I am so sorry that that was removed from Case Open, along with these and other pictures! You would have had a really historical book. As NEVER AGAIN! can be.

If you reprint, I hope you will insert a table of contents and ^{replace} eliminate the wrong inside subtitle with that on the cover. So you do not give the table of contents a page number. You have a dozen blank pages anyway.
