Dear Hal,

The usual rush. Glad to get the USA comment on Liebeler that Stan sent me. I haven't yet seen the Blazewick transcript and I should have because today I spoke to a man who either today or tomorrow is in quest of Hall and the others. Please send me a copy as soon as possible, indicating if it is unchecked. I can return it after you have finished checking it, but I should know the content. I'll soon be leaving on new trips and it will then be unavailable if you send it.

Those Remparts people are at least the most stretched. Again they are using my material, pretending it is their own, without even a footnote to indicate that it is mine. I'm shocked that Turner does this as often as he does, particularly when on the only occasion he has deigned to mention my name it is bracketed with a nasty personal crack, like he is God and he is disposing.

This leads me to the tape recording of the speech I made at Golden Gate Park a year ago. I was to have been given a copy and never got it. I am now particularly anxious to get it because of Keating's tacit admission that I am Le Boeuf.

There seems to be no end of this literary kleptomania. I am rapidly getting to the point where I will no longer be silent. There is no excuse for this continuing dishonesty from our side, every reason to do something about it. Perhaps I have already delayed too long.

I have a call in for Minkie. Welsh is not in the office today. I doubt if he will call back. If he does not, then I will know that he knows the purpose of my call and is for that reason ducking it.

Right now, unless they issue a statement acknowledging that this is my material, I'll be looking for the first opportunity to go over their record. The time is past when I'll continue to cover up every crooked bastard who pretends he is seeking the truth and in so doing does little but lift my material and pocket what is not his. My debts are too great to permit it. I think you know how widespread this is and understand that it is more than thievery, for it inhibits what I can do that they can subsequently use.

If you want to see what Turner actually said of me, after lifting so much (including some of the Minutemen stuff, if not his actual leads and sources), note the nastiness with which he paraphrases Schiller and Lewis (Forgive My Grief II, 159).

Anyway, as soon as you can, please send me the B interview and this tape.

First I would like to say I greatly admire your work; your honesty and dedication is beyond reproach. Thanks again for what you are doing and doing so well.

I just completed "Photographic Whiteman" and feel it is another masterpiece! A suggestion might be in order regarding a second publishing of this book; namely at the appropriate places in the text of the book the page numbers of the government documents ~~discussed~~ should be given. Not (as you have it now) the reverse situation, where some of the documents in the appendix of the book have pages cited to refer the reader back to your text.

One other point concerns several critical questions you raise which I don't believe you give evidence in the text that you have attempted to answer them. I feel if this is so, and you have looked into them, it would be helpful if this was stated. If you haven't checked these out, possibly they should be analyzed before entering other research areas. I preface my following questions as a self assigned "spokesman" for how I think the public will react to

A. J. L'Hoste did on his assignment  
that Nov. day? Have you seen  
his photos if he took some?

8) page 57 - Have you contacted  
Tom Dillard to see what he has  
left in the way of original photos?

- 9) page 77 - Has the Lovelady Shirt been placed in the National Archives?
- 10) page 81 - Do you now have a good <sup>up-to-date</sup> description of Willis's equipment.
- 11) page 86 - Did you ever find out <sup>no</sup> the identity of the reporter with the camera and a strobe unit?
- 12) pages 88, 93 - Did you or any friends <sup>no</sup> see <sup>the</sup> <sup>President</sup> <sup>Surveillance</sup> pictures of President Johnson? Have you checked with him to see if any of his photos of assassination are still available or are they all lost?
- 13) page 105 - Has Mr. Sprague published <sup>no</sup> any of his findings?
- 14) page 113 - Has NBC collected <sup>yes</sup> indexing their assassination tapes?
- 15) page 117 - Have all of the Dallas <sup>Don't</sup> TV stations film been erased from their <sup>now</sup> tapes?
- 16) page 121 - Where is the Alexander <sup>film</sup> <sup>now</sup>? Have you seen it? What does it show?
- 17) page 130 - Have you seen the <sup>part</sup> <sup>Hughes</sup> original Hughes's film? Where is it <sup>now</sup>?

Since you might not have time to answer this letter, I hope you will consider addressing yourself to answering the valid questions in your future works.

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I will be ordering your other books  
but I would gladly wait some time  
if some of these photos could just  
be found and analyzed to further  
the investigation.
