Hearings vowed on Schorr leak

Washington (AP)—The chairman of the House Ethics Committee, Representative John J. Flynt, Jr. (D., Ga.) said yesterday that he expects to hold public hearings in the investigation into who leaked the House intelligence committee's final report to Daniel L. Schorr, the CBS correspondent.

Mr. Flynt told newsmen he expects to complete the investigation within six weeks, barring unforeseen complications.

The chairman said committee investigators have interviewed more than 125 people in the inquiry but refused to say if they have determined who leaked the report to Mr. Schorr.

Mr. Schorr obtained a copy of the report the week before the full House voted an order that it be kept secret.
