House ethics committee investigators to question them about who leaked the secret House intelligence report.

Schorr said he was asked to appear thet week. He said he replied he would not without a subpoena and, even then, "would not testify with regard to sources."

Schorr has acknowledged Sohorr has acknowledged that he was responsible for publication of the text of the House intelligence committee's classified final report in The Village Voice, a New York weekly newspaner. per.

The other five reporters said investigators asked to "chat" with them about the case. All five said they refused on grounds that they could not reveal sources. None of the six was suppoenaed.

The five other newsmen are Jim Adams of the Associated Press, Nicholas Horrock and John Crewdson of The New York Times, Ford Rowan of NBC News and Ranjit de Silva of Reuter news agency. news agency. 1 1
